**SUBJECT:** AB 1161 (Harabedian) — **SUPPORT** 

Dear Assemblymember Lee:

With roughly one-third of California's population receiving health care coverage through Medi-Cal, it is critical to ensure beneficiaries receive necessary care — especially in cases of displacement caused by emergency conditions following such events as the 2025 Eaton and Palisades fires in Los Angeles County. These life-altering conditions often interrupt patient care and exacerbate underlying health issues, alongside a myriad of other negative consequences to the affected communities. Thus, it is of vital importance to ensure that adversely impacted Medi-Cal beneficiaries continue to receive uninterrupted care throughout a declared state of emergency or health emergency.

For this reason, the California Hospital Association (CHA), on behalf of more than 400 hospitals and health systems, supports Assembly Bill (AB) 1161, which would require the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to provide Medi-Cal beneficiaries continuous eligibility if they have been displaced or affected by a declared state of emergency or health emergency. The bill would further require other state departments overseeing vital social services benefit programs — including the California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) program and CalFresh — to similarly ensure continuous eligibility throughout the duration of these emergency periods.

The Eaton and Palisades fires displaced approximately 150,000 Los Angeles County residents and affected many more. Throughout the duration of these fires and periods following, DHCS and the hospital community continue to prioritize the health and safety of those impacted. By enacting AB 1161, the state is better equipped to more efficiently maintain this prioritization of health and safety during future emergencies.

CHA is committed to ensuring that the health care needs of all Californians are prioritized, especially those adversely impacted by emergency conditions. For these reasons, **CHA strongly requests your** "AYE" vote for AB 1161.
