FEDERAL

Federal Update (O'Rourke)

The Senate Finance Committee on Thursday approved a <u>draft bipartisan bill</u> aimed at reducing the cost of drugs in Medicare and Medicaid programs. The measure would penalize drug manufacturers if they raise their prices higher than the rate of inflation and would take other steps to lower costs for the government and seniors on Medicare's prescription drug benefit, Part D. Earlier this week, House leadership announced they would unveil their long-awaited plan to reduce drug prices. Leadership from both chambers have indicated this will be a priority issue for Congress in the fall.

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA) and Treasury Secretary Mnuchin reached a \$2.7 trillion federal budget agreement to lift spending limits for the next two years and extend the federal government's borrowing authority through July 2021. The agreement, passed by the House on Thursday and due for Senate consideration next week, could pave the way to avoiding another government shutdown before the 2020 elections. Of note for hospitals: the spending increases are partially offset by extending sequestration on domestic spending, including Medicare payments, for an additional two years, through 2029.

After voting on the budget agreement, the House adjourned for its August recess; the Senate will adjourn next week. Both chambers will be back in session Sept. 9.
