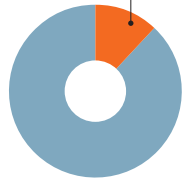


# Federal Funds Fall Short of Relief CA Hospitals Need

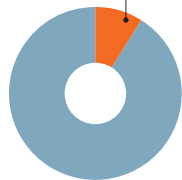
**CA Hospital Losses Driven by COVID-19**  
(est. thru Dec. 2020)

**\$14.6 billion**

(losses from revenue only; does not include costs related to PPE, physical space conversion, ventilators, and more)

## The bottom line:

Federal relief covers less than  
**60%**  
of the losses.

And these losses don't address major cost spikes in ongoing readiness for COVID-19 and other costs; for example, the pre-COVID cost for a basic surgical mask was **4 cents**; it now tops **60 cents**.



## Federal Funding for Health Care Providers

**\$186.5 billion**

total from CARES, Consolidated Appropriations, and American Rescue Plan Acts

### General Distribution

- **\$92.5 billion (\$5.68b)**  
based on net patient service revenue and expenses and losses related to COVID-19 (Apr., Dec.)

### Targeted Distribution

high-impact distributions (May, July)

- **\$9.4 billion (\$19.6m)**
