

Federal Funds Fall Short of Relief CA Hospitals Need



Federal Funding for Health Care Providers

\$186.5 billion

total from CARES, Consolidated Appropriations, and American Rescue Plan Acts

General Distribution

- **\$76.5 billion** (\$5.68b) based on net patient service revenue and expenses and losses related to COVID-19 (April, Dec.)

Targeted Distribution

- **\$20.8 billion** (\$917m) high-impact distributions (May, July)
- **\$11.1 billion** (\$337m) rural distributions (May, June)
- **\$10 billion** (\$19.6m) 1,109 SNF providers (May, Sept., Oct)
- **\$13.1 billion** (\$1.48b) safety-net hospitals (June, July)
- **\$1.1 billion** (\$158.2m) freestanding children's hospitals
- **\$520 million** tribal hospitals, clinics, and health centers

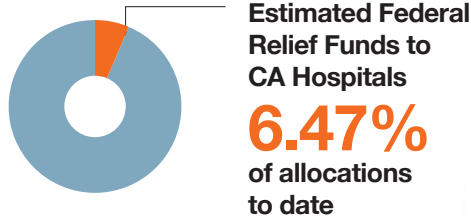
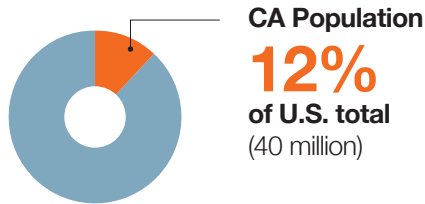
- **\$133 billion** total for health care provider relief
- **\$5.4 billion** uninsured testing and treatment
- **\$8.6 billion** total for CA hospitals

CA Hospital Losses Driven by COVID-19 (est. thru Dec. 2021)

\$15.6 billion

These losses are driven by increased expenses associated with caring for COVID-19 patients and lost revenue as a result of the pandemic.



Estimated Federal Relief Funds to CA Hospitals

\$8.6 billion

The bottom line:

Estimated federal relief covers **55%** of the losses.
