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


Faculty

- Complaint and FRI Investigations:
 - ✓ Target Deployment: Late January

GACHs

- Complaints & FRI's, State Surveys, and Federal IC Surveys
 - ✓ Target Deployment: 2021

All Other Facility Types

- Complaints & FRI's, State Surveys, and Federal IC Surveys
 - Target Deployment: Late 2021

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Key Features

- Paperless survey process for surveyors and facilities
 - ✓ Reduces time to task for surveyors
 - ✓ Allows CDPH to use robust analytics to monitor compliance trends in real time and over periods of time
- Single Sign on for Facilities
 - ✓ Facilities can view Statements of Deficiency, submit Plans of Correction, and attach Documentation within the app
 - ✓ Facilities can easily access all survey reports with action items and complete surveys as-needed
- Automatic POC submission deadline reminders

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2020 Chaptered Legislation

AB 2037 (Wicks) Health Facilities: Notices

- Extends the timeframes for notifications a hospital must provide prior to closing a hospital, reducing or eliminating emergency services, or relocating or eliminating a supplemental service

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2020 Chaptered Legislation (cont.)

SB 275 (Pan) - Health Care and Essential Workers: personal protective equipment

- Requires CDPH to develop a PPE stockpile and establish guidelines required PPE

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Current Regulatory Proposals

- ... **Adverse Events:** Enacts regulations to clarify statutory language related to reporting adverse events.
- ... **Medical Information Breach:** Establishes standards for assessing breaches of patient medical information and for administrative penalties related to such breaches.

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Regulations in Development

- ... **Emergency Services / Specialized Services/Medical Imaging / Observation:** Updates requirements by incorporating current standards of care.
- ... **Infection Control / Physical Plant:** Updates physical plant requirements and enacts infection control regulations to incorporate current CDC guidelines.

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Regulations in Development (cont.)

- ... **Administration / Records & Reporting / Medical Records / Small & Rural Hospitals / Medical Services:** Updates and clarifies requirements related to hospital licensure, reporting, medical records, and assists in preserving hospital services in underserved communities.
- ... **Nursing / Surgical / Anesthesia / Patient Rights / Cardiovascular Surgery / Cardiac Cath Lab:** Incorporates current standards of care in three basic hospital services and updates patient rights requirements.

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Regulations in Development (cont.)

- ... **Pharmacy / Dietary / Clinical Lab:** Updates and clarifies requirements by incorporating current standards of care for three basic services.
- ... **Rehab Services / Outpatient Services / Supportive Services:** Incorporates current standards of care to services for inpatients and outpatients as part of hospital services.

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Coming Soon – Centralized Program Flex

- CHCQ is transitioning the Program Flex Review Process to headquarters
- Improve consistency and efficiency of the review and approval process
- Introduce an online application process
