Current outcomes for ballot measures, elected offices of interest to California hospitals

## Ballot Measures of Interest

● Pass ● Fail

**Leaning Pass** **Prop. 14:** Authorizes \$5.5 billion in general obligation bonds for the state's stem cell research institute.

**Leaning Fail** **Prop. 15:** A split roll property tax that increases taxes by reassessing business property every three years, including investor-owned hospitals. *CHA opposed*

● **Prop. 16:** A Constitutional amendment that reinstates affirmative action in university admissions and public hiring. *CHA supported*

● **Prop. 22:** Classifies app-based drivers as independent contractors except under certain circumstances.

● **Prop. 23:** Requires at least one licensed physician on site during treatment at outpatient kidney dialysis clinics. Could impact patient services. *CHA opposed*

**Leaning Fail** **Measure LH:** Creates a hospital tax in Lynwood, equivalent to 3% of a hospital's gross receipts, for funding local programs. *CHA opposed*

## More Elections Coming?

The following races could trigger Senate special elections:

- **Los Angeles County Supervisor:** Sen. Holly Mitchell (D-Los Angeles) **defeated** Los Angeles City Councilmember Herb Wesson
- **San Diego County Supervisor:** Community College Board Member Nora Vargas **leading** vs. Sen. Ben Hueso (D-San Diego)

## Election Results Timeline

County officials have 30 days to count ballots and conduct a post-election audit. Final results must be reported to the Secretary of State for the presidential contest by Dec. 1 and all other contests by Dec. 4. The Secretary of State will certify results on Dec. 11. Vote-by-mail ballots postmarked on or before Election Day can arrive until Nov. 20 and still be counted.
