

# Federal Funds Fall Short of Relief CA Hospitals Need



## Federal Funding for Health Care Providers

**\$186.5 billion**

total from CARES, Consolidated Appropriations, and American Rescue Plan Acts

### General Distribution

- **\$94.8 billion** (\$6.77b)

based on net patient service revenue and expenses and losses related to COVID-19

### Targeted Distribution

- **\$20.7 billion** (\$917m)

high-impact distributions

- **\$11 billion** (\$345m)

rural distributions

- **\$9.4 billion** (\$19.6m)

SNF providers

- **\$13.1 billion** (\$1.55b)

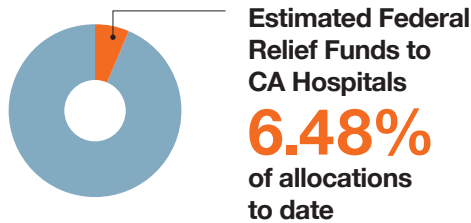
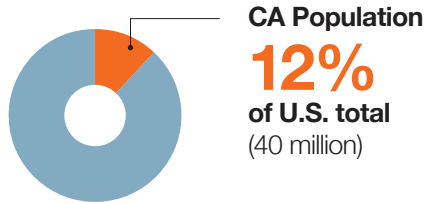

## CA Hospital Losses Driven by COVID-19

(est. thru Dec. 2021)

**\$16.3 billion**

These losses are driven by increased expenses associated with caring for COVID-19 patients and lost revenue as a result of the pandemic.



## Estimated Federal Relief Funds to CA Hospitals

**\$9.8 billion**

## The bottom line:

- Estimated federal relief covers **60%** of the losses.

- Specific relief has not been provided for the period after March 31, 2021 which includes the Delta and Omicron surges.
