...In 2021, the pandemic inflated that number to 194 per day.

Per day were dying of unintended opioid overdoses in the United States¹

People died from overdoses, highest ever recorded by the CDC, including ~70K from opioids

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The state of the crisis:

More lives were lost from unintentional overdoses in 2021 than in any prior year

The need for a scalable solution has never been more clear

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1. Build a “front door” to improve access, assessment, and placement in care



2. Augment care options to improve access to outpatient services through telehealth



3. Build and expand in-person services to build comprehensive continuums



Assess quality and performance of all partners and providers in the system, improving quality of care and patient engagement



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Proposed Initial Target Counties

Butte, Fresno*, Humboldt*, Sacramento*, Sierra, Siskiyou*, & Sonoma

These counties meet majority of the following:

- Has at least 1 hospital/ED (Sierra has 0)
- Has at least 1 major health system
- High-risk for drug-related ED visit and death rates, particularly in 18-25 group
- 1 or more CSUs for SUD:
 - Butte = Butte County Crisis Services
 - Fresno = Exodus Recovery Fresno CSC
 - Humboldt = Psychiatric Emergency Services
 - Sacramento = Behavioral Health Crisis Services Collaborative (CSU) + Sacramento County (ISU)
- 0 CSUs for SUD in Sierra, Siskiyou & Sonoma

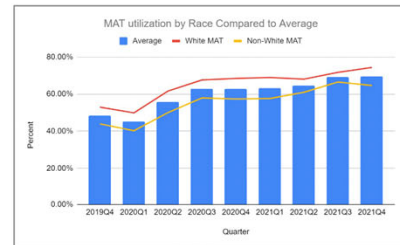

Example of evidence based practice in action



Medication for treatment of OUD is an evidence-based practice that improves outcomes and saves lives.

Percent of patients with OUD who are on medication continue to increase among both White and non-White participants.

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Target Outcomes: Access, Engagement & Quality

Expand availability of clinicians, social workers, therapists, and peers by ~25%, using hybrid, in-person and remote care to scale the workforce rapidly.

Empower individuals to make informed decisions about their care using a geographically-specific **person-centered model** that integrates outcomes data and community resources.

Improve **quality of life and social determinants of health** via measurement of components of Addiction Severity Index as a driver to increase access to a sustainable solution for the community.

Use a tech-enabled collection of patient-reported recovery outcomes to understand opportunities for **individual progress and infrastructure improvement**.

Boost economic health of the community by **increasing rates of recovery by serving up to 10,000 patients in the first 2 years**, as measured by community tenure, job placement and training, and family reunification.
