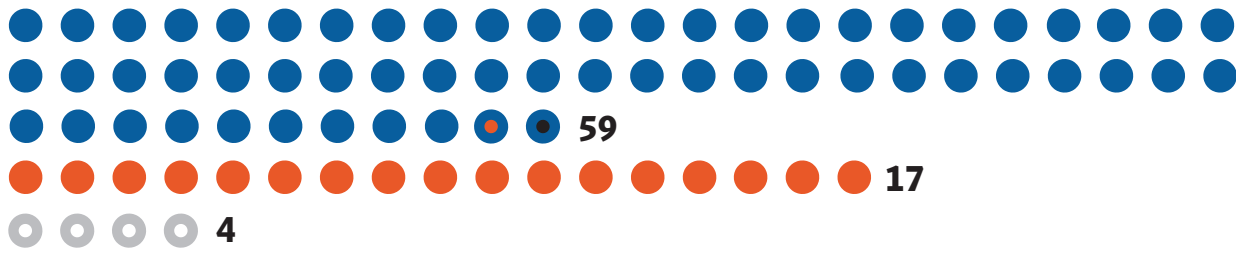
### State Senate and Assembly Overview

Term limits and retirements have led to 10 open seats in the state Senate and 22 open seats in the Assembly. As a result, we will be losing some of our health care champions. Many of the new candidates will be coming from local governments, and therefore will be new to statewide politics. In addition, they will have limited experience and exposure to health care policy, creating both challenges and opportunities to educate these new members about issues critical to hospitals and the communities they serve.

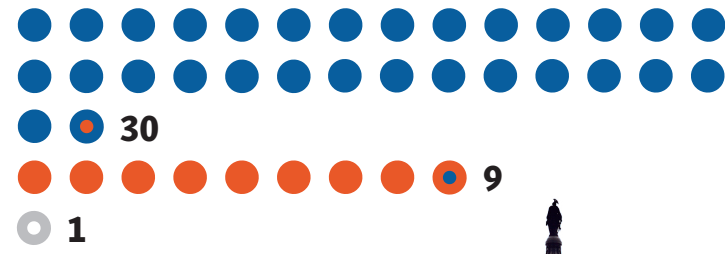
